GENERAL TOURNAMENT RULES

Club de Yates y Pesca Challenge is a two (2) tournaments serie that will pay to top boats of the combined tournament series

Each tournament of the challenge has also its own awards and payout.

General entry to the CLUB DE YATES Y PESCA CHALLENGE 2025 features two (2) divisions: (i) Billfish + Gamefish, and Gamefish Only(ii) (Tuna, Dorado, Wahoo, Almaco Jack, Pargo, & Sierra). Trophies and cash awards will be presented to the top three teams (1st, 2nd, and 3rd place) for their aggregate performance in each respective division over two days of fishing.

General entry includes up to six (6) registered anglers, one (1) boat captain, and two (2) deckhands only. Each team must designate and register anglers and crew, with a total team consisting of no more than nine (9) members.

In the Billfish Division, teams are awarded points for successfully catching and releasing sailfish, & marlin. Billfish release must be clearly documented on video according to specific tournament rules.

In the Gamefish Divisions, each team may weigh their respective Tuna, Dorado, Wahoo, Almaco Jack, Pargo, and Sierra. Teams may weigh tree (3) fish per species each day. At the end of the final day of tournament fishing, team rankings will be determined for each gamefish division based on their individual weight of each fish per species throughout the tournament.

The Jr Angler award of each tournament will be determined based on the individual weight of each valid specie throughout the tournament. Heaviest fish will win. Jr Angler valid species will include all species based on boat division registry. If a Billfish is videoed as a Jr Angler, weight will be based on 100 pounds for sailfish and 300 ponds for Marlin.

ENTRY FEES AND OPTIONAL JACKPOT

General entry fee for Billfish + Gamefish divisions: \$3,000

General entry for Gamefish divisions only : \$700

Entry fees include registration to both tournament dates and CYP CHALLENGE awards and prizes.

Optional daily jackpots are individual for each tournament and will be divided equally for both days of tournament and paid 70% to 1st place and 30% to 2nd place of each day.

There are also top team per tournament and challenge jackpots.



CYP CHALLENGE WINNERS WILL BE DETERMINED AS FOLLOW:

- CYP CHALLENGE BILLFISH BOAT will be the boat with maximum total BILLFISH points throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE TOP SAILFISH BOAT will be the boat with maximum total SAILFISH points throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE MARLIN BOAT will be the boat with maximum total MARLIN points throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE DORADO BOAT will be the boat with maximum total combined weight of the top 3 DORADO throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE TUNA BOAT will be the boat with maximum total combined weight of the top 3 TUNA throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE WAHOO BOAT will be the boat with maximum total combined weight of the top 3 WAHOO throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE ALMACO JACK BOAT will be the boat with maximum total combined weight of the top 3 ALMACO JACK throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE JR ANGLER will be the JR ANGLER (up to 15 yrs old) with the maximum total combined weight of the top 3 fish throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments)
- CYP CHALLENGE FEMALE ANGLER will be the FEMALE ANGLER with the maximum BILLFISH release points throughout the entire CYP Challenge (Both Tournaments).

ANGLING & TACKLE RULES

- Teams may include no more than six (6) registered anglers, one (1) boat captain and two (2) deckhands/mates, for a total of nine (9) team members maximum.
- All billfish must be released; offset circle hooks are forbidden.
- Fish must be caught on standard/manual rod and reel equipment during advertised tournament hours
- Teams may use live bait or dead bait, with non-offset, in-line circle hooks or lures with standard J-Hooks, so long as offset circle hooks are not used.
- All billfish must be released and videoed from the back/stern/aft of the vessel. While casting, hooking, and fighting fish from the bow is acceptable, billfish must be in clear sight and released from the aft of the vessel in order for them to count towards billfish release points and jackpots.
- Teams must strictly abide by all PANAMA Fisheries and other applicable laws. All billfish must be released; and offset circle hooks are forbidden.
- 130lb. manufacturers stated maximum line class. Leader length shall not exceed 30 feet. The maximum combined length of double line and leader shall be limited to 40 feet.
- Anglers may receive assistance from their captain/crew in hooking their fish. Because this is a fun tournament, it is perfectly acceptable for registered anglers and crew to hook the fish and pass registered anglers the rod; however, after the initial pass there are no additional passes of the rod allowed. Angling must be done by the angler who received the rod after it was hooked and passed.
Note: See Gamefish Divisions for tuna exception

*All rules will be reviewed at Captain's Meeting. Any last-minute changes announced at the Captain's Meeting will be enforced, so we recommend one member from each team attend. It is the responsibility of each team to read and understand all rules, including any changes or adjustments.

All times are at Panama Time Zone (GMT -6hrs)

Lines-in and lines-out only applies to billfish fishing. boats can fish for gamefish from shotgun start time.

For Billfish Division: there will be two (2) check in locations on day 1. pearl island marina and tropic star lodge (piñas bay). at both sites there will be a package with your day 2 official colored tournament card.

4:00pm – 6:30pm – at the end of each fishing day, teams will be asked to drop-off billfish release scorecards and have completed uploading all video evidence of each individual billfish release at the official documentation station located at tournament weight station in pearl island marina or with the tropic star lodge official at piñas bay. at this moment teams will require to also hand in official colored tournament card from day 1 and receive an envelope with the day 2 card.

For Gamefish only boats there is no mandatory check in on day 1 nor check out at day 2

For gamefish there will be scales open only at pearl island marina on both days

Gamefish boated on day 1 can be weighted on day 2 if properly iced and maintained *see gamefish regulations – note that boats not showing to official weigh station on day one, can only win daily jackpots of day 2 if weighted on day 2.

Daily fishing hours on billfish division: 7:30am-4:00pm – teams are asked to be lined up outside pearl island marina basin by 5:45am of day 1, for an official shotgun start promptly at 6:00am, after which they may begin fishing at lines-in 7:30 am. fish hooked prior to lines-out (4:00pm) may be fought until released, or lost for a maximum of 30 min for sailfish and 90 min for marlin, after lines out time. must report billfish hookup on the official tournament whats app group before lines-out and release time after.

Weigh in: 4:00pm – 6:30pm – only at pearl island marina – weigh-ins will be by order of arrival. one of the registered team mates or boat crew must show to the weigh station to sign on to the official arrival to scale list. scales close at 6:30pm; however, if there are fish waiting to be weighed beyond official close time, they will be accepted, so long as contact and confirmation has been made by signing in on the official arrival to scale list with the weigh master or tournament director, and the boat has made it in and is simply waiting for its turn at the scales scale by closing.

Billfish release video documentation: all billfish boats must have starlink or any other form of internet at all times. all billfish release reports and communications will be done in a official tournament whats app chat group that will include boat captain plus one assigned team member.

All boats are required at lines-in time of each day to upload a video that must show gps time and date plus the official daily colored card. this video will officially mark lines-in time. this applies to all boats on billfish division. boats that dont log this video will not be able to log furdur release videos for the day.

All videos of released billfish complete with required details must be uploaded in the catch stats app by each team as soon as the fish has been released. videos will not be accepted after 6:30pm on each day

All videos will be reviewed as they are uploaded and scores will be updated on catch stats live scoring

BILLFISH RELEASE DIVISION - SCORING OVERVIEW

The team which scores the most billfish release points combined over the two (2) days of tournament fishing will win the Billfish Release Division. All billfish releases must be reported on the Tournament Official Whats App Group, recorded on video and uploaded to the Catch Stats App. All videos will be reviewed upon uploaded, and updated to Catch Stats Live scoring <https://clubdeyates.catchstat.com/>

Qualifying billfish species are sailfish, and marlin. Teams will be ranked based on their two-day combined release point total. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place will be awarded.

Points are scored as follows:

Billfish Species	Points per Release
Marlin	500
Sailfish	100

Note: Billfish that cannot be clearly identified will be scored as 100 point.

BILLFISH RELEASE VIDEO REQUIREMENTS

Properly documented video evidence of each released billfish must be provided to tournament officials by uploading to the CATCH STATS App before end of each fishing day (Lines Out). If a fish on has been reported on the Tournament official Whats App Group Chat before lines out time of each day, it will be accepted to report release in the next 45min after lines out time.

To be scored, the release video must contain a continuous sequence with the following items:

- Ability to show time/date of each release
- A registered tournament angler fighting the fish from the aft or cockpit of the vessel.
- A mate touching the leader with the fish boat side and at the aft or cockpit of the vessel. To identify species, clear video showing the fish's distinctive traits must be provided.
- Tournament provided daily color-coded tournament card in clear view on the video, to mark completion of a catch

- Video of the leader being cut, or the fish unhooked and released from the aft or cockpit of the vessel, followed by at least 3 seconds of continuous video showing the fish no longer attached.
- Video must show a clearly healthy fish being released.
- No boating of billfish of any kind is accepted.
- No mutilated billfish of any kind will be allowed.

If proper video is not supplied to the reasonable satisfaction of the Tournament Director, your catch will not be scored. Teams must supply their own video recording device with the ability to show time/date.

Tournament Officials' rulings on release evidence are final; there will be no protests allowed for video evidence. Submitted tournament videos may be used by Club de Yates y Pesca de Panama and/or Club de Yates y Pesca Challenge for marketing or other purposes, worldwide, at Tournament organizers sole discretion.

Teams are not required to call in hook-ups but are required to call in releases, with the exception of a fish near lines-out time, boat will be required to report hook up or fish on the line minutes before, so release be accepted prior to lines-out time. When calling in releases on the Official Tournament Whats App Chat please give the scorekeeper the boat name, angler name, and species of fish released. Once your release is confirmed, you will receive an official release time on the Official Tournament Whats App Chat Group. Official release status and points will be awarded once tournament officials have received the uploaded video and reviewed your billfish release video documentation. All releases are unofficial until all billfish releases have been reviewed and confirmed by tournament officials.

IN EVENT OF A TIE: If there is a tie in aggregate billfish release points by multiple teams at the end of the two-day tournament, rankings will be determined by the first team to reach their aggregate point total by time and date of catch.

Example: If "Team A" reached their point total at 1:00pm and "Team B" reached their point total at 2:00pm, "Team A" beats "Team B". PLEASE NOTE: Make sure your video time/date profiles are accurate to local Panama Time Zone (GMT -6hrs).

GAMEFISH DIVISIONS: TUNA, DORADO, WAHOO, ALMACO JACK, PARGO, AND SIERRA – SCORING OVERVIEW

There are SIX (6) eligible Gamefish Divisions, in which the following rules apply: At the end of each day of tournament fishing, teams may weigh their respective Tuna, Dorado, Wahoo, Almaco Jack, Pargo, and Sierra. Each team may weigh three (3) fish per species each day.

At the end of the final day of tournament fishing, team rankings will be determined for each gamefish division based on their fish weight per species throughout the two-day tournament.

In the tuna category only, it is acceptable to use a one-time angler switch during one tuna battle per day, per team. The following procedures must be followed for the fish to be eligible to score points in the tournament:

- One (1) angler switch allowed per day for tuna only
- The switch must be between two (2) registered anglers; registered crew members can assist in the switch but may not turn the reel handle and gain line at any time during the switch

NOTE: If no qualifying fish are scored in a particular tournament Gamefish Division, the entry money will be divided equally among 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place divided equally among all CYP Challenge winners. If only 1st and 2nd place are handed out, the 3rd place money will be evenly distributed amongst 1st and 2nd. If only one team places in the general entry, 1st place will receive the money from 1st, 2nd, and 3rd.

Minimum Weight per Gamefish to Qualify

Dorado 15 lbs
Tuna 15 lbs
Wahoo 15 lbs
Almaco Jack 15 lbs
Pargo 15 lbs
Sierra 5 lbs

Each division will be awarded 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place cash and prizes.

The tail of each fish brought to the scales will be clipped, signifying that it has been weighed and scored. All fish that appear to have been altered, spoiled, mutilated or frozen will be disqualified, per the discretion of tournament officials. Any boat which enters a fish that is proven to have been weight-altered, frozen, or previously weighed will be disqualified from the tournament.

ALL GAMEFISH AFTER BEING WEIGHTED WILL REQUIRE TO BE INSPECTED AND SAMPLE COLLECTED BY ARAP (PANAMA FISHERY AUTHORITY) ON THE ASSIGNED TABLE NEXT TO THE WEIGHT STATION



GENERAL ENTRY & AWARDS PAYOUTS

All teams must pay the fee for the General Entry to participate in the tournament and be eligible for awards.

OPTIONAL DAILY JACKPOTS

Daily Jackpot winners will be determined by single-heaviest qualifying fish of the day in the Tuna, Dorado, Wahoo, Almaco Jack, Pargo and Sierra jackpot categories, and by the most daily release points in the Billfish Release categories. The purchase of a daily jackpot is split evenly over the two-day tournament, and then divided 70/30 between 1st and 2nd place daily winners.

GAMEFISH TIE BREAKERS/ROLLOVERS: In the event of a tie in any of the gamefish daily jackpots, money will be split evenly between the teams with the tied weight (50/50). If no qualifying fish are weighed or scored in a jackpot category on the first day of the tournament, the money will roll to Day 2; if no qualifying fish are weighed or scored in a jackpot category on the second day of the tournament, the money will roll back to the Day 1 winner. In the unlikely event that no qualifying fish are scored in a given jackpot category, the monies collected for the unfulfilled jackpot category will be paid back to each respective entrant of that category, minus the 20% administrative fees.

BILLFISH RELEASE TIE BREAKERS/ROLLOVERS: If there is a tie in aggregate billfish release points by multiple teams at the end of a given tournament day, the daily jackpot winner will be determined by the first team to reach their aggregate point total by time (verified by release video date/time). Example: If "Team A" reached their point total at 1:00pm and "Team B" reached their point total at 2:00pm, "Team A" beats "Team B". In the unlikely event that no qualifying fish are scored in a given jackpot category during the two-day tournament, the monies collected for the unfulfilled jackpot category will be paid back to each respective entrant of that category, minus the 20% administrative fees.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

NOTES ON CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS: Credit card payments will require a surcharge of 3.5%; All credit card charges are made by Catch Stats

REGISTRATION: All teams wishing to enter the tournament must complete registration online at <https://clubdeyates.catchstat.com/> ; or during Team Check-In/Registration of each tournament (2:00–6:00pm) at Pearl Island Marina. Tournament entry fees and optional jackpots must be determined, listed, and payment received at the time of registration.

GOVERNMENT PERMITS: It is the responsibility of registered boat captains & anglers to comply with all Panama laws regarding maritime authorities, customs, and border control requirements. This is a requirement of Panamá and is not a tournament rule—permit and licensing infractions have no bearing on tournament results or awards.

PROTESTS: Any protests must be made in writing and presented to the tournament director accompanied by \$500 cash, NO LATER than 8:00pm on the 2nd day of the tournament. You will be asked to provide a statement and any photo/video or other form of supporting documentation surrounding the claim. Protests will be ruled on by Tournament Director and supporting staff. The decision of the Tournament Director is final.
